COPS Office Background



- 1994 Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act
- Mission:
 - Advancement of Community Policing
 - Primary Constituent is Law Enforcement

Funding Overview

COPS Office investments since 1994:

- \$11.2 billion in awards to advance community policing through over 42,400 grants and cooperative agreements
- To over 13,600 State, Local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies

Funding Overview (cont'd)

- Funded over 121,500 officers and sheriff's deputies
- Assisted more than 4,400 agencies with over \$2.4 billion in funding for crime-fighting technology.



Funding Overview (cont'd)

- To date, COPS has disseminated over 2,000,000 knowledge products.
- Trained more than 500,000 policing professional and community leaders.
- \$377 million in fund is to address issues of production, proliferation, prevention, and distribution of methamphetamine.



Funding Overview - Ohio

- To Date, the COPS Office has awarded \$376,491,925 in COPS grants to 648 law enforcement agencies in the State of Ohio.
- COPS grants have funded 4,074 additional police officers and sheriffs deputies to engage in community policing activities, including crime prevention, in Ohio.



Funding Overview - Ohio

- \$71,659,176 has been awarded for crime-fighting technologies. This funding has allowed officers to spend more time on the streets of Ohio fighting and preventing crime through timesaving technology, information-sharing systems, and improved communications equipment.

COPS Grant Programs



Current Status of CHP

- Over 6,200 applications totaling over \$7 billion still pending from FY 2010.
- Agencies will be asked to update their applications in June to be eligible for FY 2010.
- \$298 million is available to make awards this year.



COPS Grant Programs



Secure Our Schools (SOS) Program

- Open solicitation for all local, state, and tribal law enforcement agencies that have primary law enforcement authority within a partner primary or secondary school
- Funding to establish and enhance school safety equipment, training and programs



COPS Grant Programs



Secure Our Schools (SOS) Program

Requirements

A local cash match of 50% towards the total cost of the approved grant project is required

- May be used for
 - The placement and use of metal detectors, locks, lighting, and other deterrent measures
 - Security assessments
 - Security training of personnel and students
 - Coordination with local law enforcement
 - Any other measure that may provide a significant improvement in security



COPS Grant Programs



Child Sexual Predator Program (CSPP)

- Applicants nominated by a U.S. Attorney's Office or U.S. Marshal's Office, with particular need for resources to locate, arrest, and prosecute child sexual predators.
- Purpose of funding is to establish or enhance strategies to locate, arrest, and prosecute child sexual predators and to enforce state sex offender registration laws.
