\*\* This estimate is based on a recent report released by the Treasury Department, which estimates that 35 percent of eligible families in Ohio did not file for the AOTC in 2009. This percent was then applied to the county-by-county data released by the Ohio Board of Regents on the number of students enrolled in higher education. This then took into consideration that 95 percent of Ohio families fall within the threshold that would qualify them for the credit. Ohioans can amend their prior tax returns to claim filings.
