I write to offer my support for the Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Ohio and the Commonwealth of Kentucky regarding the future construction of a new I-71/I-75 bridge connecting the two states. Moving ahead with this project is an economic imperative that is of great importance to Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

Clearly, the replacement of the Brent Spence Bridge, one of the 15 major interstate bridges which the federal government has labeled "functionally obsolete," will improve the flow of traffic on this busy freight corridor and increase driver safety.
